

2026 TQIP Annual Conference HIPAA, Privacy, and Media Rights Agreement

HIPAA AGREEMENT

The Federal Health Insurance Portability and Accountability Act of 1996 (HIPAA) privacy regulations govern the use and dissemination of information found on patients' medical records and all other identifiable health information. In effort to maintain compliance with current HIPAA regulations, the American College of Surgeons requires session participants to remove all protected health information (PHI) from all written, visual, and verbal presentation materials. For example, PHI includes, in part, patient names, locations, biometric identifiers, full or partial facial photographs, and any other unique identifying number, characteristic, or code.

STATE PRIVACY LAWS AND REGULATIONS

ACS is committed to protecting the confidentiality, integrity, and security of all PHI, personally identifiable information (PII), and other sensitive personal information that ACS collects, receives, maintains, processes, transmits, or otherwise possesses.

ACS complies with all applicable state privacy laws, data protection laws, breach notification laws, consumer privacy laws, health information privacy laws, and related regulations governing PHI and PII, to the extent such laws and regulations apply to ACS and its operations. ACS maintains administrative, technical, and physical safeguards designed to protect such information against unauthorized access, use, disclosure, alteration, or destruction.

ACS uses and discloses protected health information and personally identifiable information only as permitted or required by applicable law, regulation, contractual obligation, or valid authorization. ACS also takes reasonable steps to ensure that its workforce members, contractors, service providers, and other authorized representatives who may access such information are subject to appropriate confidentiality, privacy, and security obligations.

American College of Surgeons requires session participants to remove all PII from all written, visual, and verbal presentation materials.

MEDIA RIGHTS AGREEMENT

As part of the American College of Surgeons' ongoing effort to provide quality educational programming, the College may choose to record and disseminate course presentations (including the delivery, text, and any incorporated visual and electronic images) given at the 2026 TQIP Annual Conference via a variety of media. In order for your Presentation to be recorded, published, and/or distributed by the College, you must agree to the following:

1. You grant to the College a worldwide, perpetual, non-revocable, royalty-free license to (a) record your Presentation, including without limitation on videotape, audiotape and digitally and as a written transcript, (b) publish, distribute and/or broadcast your presentation, in whole or in part, in any present or future medium, including without limitation in print, on CDROM, on DVD, on videotape, on audiotape, via the World Wide Web, and as part of an electronically searchable database, and (c) sublicense to any third party any of the rights granted to the College in this agreement.

2. In exchange for the license granted to it, the College will ensure that any dissemination of your Presentation by the College acknowledges you as the author.
3. You may use your Presentation, at all times during the term of this agreement and after, as the basis for other presentations. This license does not prohibit you from using your Presentation in any other manner.
4. You warrant that (a) no part of your Presentation infringes upon any copyright or other intellectual property or proprietary right of any third party, (b) you have obtained appropriate permission for the College to use and publish any portion of your Presentation of which you are not the author, and (c) you have not previously disposed of any of the rights granted to the College in this agreement. You further grant permission for the College to remove any inappropriate or challenged content at the College's sole discretion
